

A Cosmic Ransom

Four weeks ago, Gaston, who is doing a pastoral internship in Florence, found himself talking to a student from the faculty of Business Economics. The young man listened attentively to the introduction to the Gospels "Two Ways to Live". At the end of it he readily took a copy of John's Gospel and agreed on a date to read it with Gaston. Halleluia! When this meeting concluded he said, "Ah, only now do I see that we're not children of God without Jesus!" (John 1: 11-13).

Many students in the faculty feel that making a statement like that would be scandalous. But it is not just in John's Gospel that we understand why we have distanced ourselves from God and the solution to this that Jesus provides. In Mark 10:45 we read Jesus' words as he teaches the disciples, "**For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.**" Here Jesus emphasises that we are hostages who can only be set free by a cosmic ransom.

Before Jesus' death and resurrection, Peter was horrified at the thought that Jesus had to die (Mark 8: 31-32). He was not convinced that Jesus was the cosmic Son of Man who Daniel saw in his vision (Daniel 7: 13-14) to whom "was given authority, glory and sovereign power." He was not prepared to shed his blood to defend Jesus, but instead abandoned him at the moment of his arrest, trial and death. But *after* the resurrection, Peter as interpreted by Mark, wrote about Jesus with great conviction.

He brings us the news that the greatness of Jesus and human deprivation can be seen in the death of Jesus. Within the worldly context in which his citizens tried to rule or "Lord it" over one another (including his very own disciples), Jesus set about serving others. In other words, instead of doing what he wanted, he submitted to the will of Father God. This is contrary to our rebellious actions toward him, which are worthy of condemnation and which distance us from God, making us prisoners of sin. But according to Mark 10: 45, instead of defying God and his fellow citizens, Jesus served them at the moment of his death. He put himself in their place. He took their place willingly to pay the ransom for the hostages.

Peter was transformed by the resurrected Jesus, who confirmed everything that he had said previously. He was convinced by Jesus' identity as the cosmic, divine Son of Man. He was convinced by the fact that human beings are in a state of imprisonment if the price is not paid by Jesus. He was convinced that Jesus' mission, and by this stage his own mission too, was to bring the liberator to the hostages. In the same way that they heard the Gospel of the apostles and were convinced by it, we too must go forth and bring the scandalous message to the university faculties. And we pray that many people in the University would say, "Ah, only now do I see that Jesus gave his life to pay the ransom and I realise that I too am one of many."
